NOTICE OF PROPOSED AMENDED REGULATION DATE: FEBRUARY 5, 2008

REGULATION TITLE & NUMBER:	USF 4.0102 Tuition and Fees
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SUMMARY:

This amended regulation will eliminate the current exemption from payment of the health fee for courses coded "off-campus." The Student Health Fee Committee recommended this change on October 9, 2007 to ensure consistent application of assessing the health fee for all courses and this charge is consistent with Florida statutes and Board of Governors regulations requiring all students to be charged fees. The proposed amended Tuition and Fees regulation follows this summary.

USF 4.0102 - Tuition and Fees

(1) Tuition is defined as fees assessed to students for enrollment in credit courses at the University of South Florida. Tuition consists of the following fees, depending on whether a student is a resident or a non-resident:

(a) Resident tuition, comprised of the following, is defined as the fees charged an enrolled student who qualifies as a Florida resident:

1. Tuition;
2. Student Financial Aid Fee;
3. Capital Improvement Trust Fund Fee;
4. Building Fee;
5. Health Fee;
6. Athletic Fee;
7. Activity and Service Fee;
8. Transportation Fee; and
9. Marshall Center Use Fee.

(b) Non-Resident tuition, comprised of the following, is defined as the fees charged an enrolled student who does not qualify as a Florida resident:

1. Tuition;
2. Out-of-State Fee;
3. Student Financial Aid Fee;
4. Out-of-State Financial Aid Fee;
5. Capital Improvement Trust Fund Fee;
6. Building Fee;
7. Health Fee;
8. Athletic Fee;
9. Activity & Service Fee;
10. Transportation Fee; and
11. Marshall Center Use Fee.

(2) Registration consists of two components:

(a) Formal selection of one or more credit courses approved and scheduled by the University;
and

(b) Tuition payment, partial or otherwise, or other appropriate arrangements for tuition payment (e.g. installment payment plans, deferment, or third party billing) for the courses in which the student is enrolled as of the end of the drop/add period.

(3) The following tuition and fees are levied and will be collected beginning with the spring 2008 semester.

(a) Students enrolled in programs other than the MD and DPT programs are assessed the following tuition and fees per student per credit hour:

** These fees are not charged for courses that are coded "off-campus."

In addition, each student is charged a flat fee per academic term as follows:

Activity and Service Flat Fee: Tampa Campus only - \$7.00.

Athletic Flat Fee: \$10.00–Tampa Campus; \$5.00–All other campuses.

***Marshall Center Use Fee @ \$20.00 Flat Fee (Tampa Campus) being in addition to the

above referenced per credit hour fee.

In-State and Out-of-State tuition is assessed on the basis of course classification: courses numbered through 4999 are assessed at the undergraduate level, and those courses numbered 5000-8999 are assessed at the graduate level.

Each student enrolled in the same undergraduate course more than twice, shall be assessed \$179.88 per credit hour in addition to the fees outlined in section (3)(a) above for each such course.

(b) Students enrolled in the Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) Professional Degree program are assessed the following fees per student per academic year:

(d) Audit Registration Fees – Audit registration assures a course space for the student; however, no grade is awarded. The fee to audit a course is the same as the In-State Tuition and other fees provided above.

(e) Registration for Zero Hours – Registration for zero hours provides for examinations, graduations, use of facilities, etc., when deemed appropriate by the University. The student is assessed In-State tuition and other fees provided above for one credit hour.
